

Administration -The Holy Spirit enables some individuals to motivate, direct and inspire God's people in such a way that they voluntarily and harmoniously work together to do the Church's work effectively. This gift involves being able to put things together, tie up all the "loose ends" and get things done and setting a pattern for others to follow. Adeptness at financing, planning, organizing, delegating responsibilities and problem-solving can be indications of the gift of administration. Hebrews 13:7, Judges 3:10, Exodus 18:13-16

Apostleship includes a combination of wisdom, discernment, leadership and teaching.Matthew 4:18-22. Acts 14:21-23

This gift involves a willingness to help others even when the jobs may be messy or involve getting into close proximity with people who are sick or distressed. Matthew 25:34-40, Acts 6:2-4

Servant Leadership - The gift of servant leadership allows individuals to assume responsibility for the leadership and guidance of a group within the church. It includes leading, facilitating, counseling and providing a pastoral presence for various parish programs. 1 Peter 5: 1-11

Why Mentor?

"I am not a teacher, but an awakener."

Biblical foundations:

- Robert Frost

- Odd calls us to do this!

 Matthew 28:16-20, Romans 12, 1 Corinthians 12, Galatians 6:1-10, Mark 1:35 2:12. These passages tell us discipleship and mentoring are not an option, but a command. We must follow out of obedience, and mentor in a multigenerational lifestyle, caring for the total person. It will move us from "just" praying to praying with care.
- Maturity rose out of webs of relationships of older people interacting with and discipling the younger (John 1:36-52, Acts 10:10).
- Acts 11-15 tells us leadership is about discipleship as Barnabas was with Paul.
- To help make our ministry/service/organization a welcoming place
- To help teach skills or practices necessary for the ministry/service/organization
- To contribute to building our parish community!

Characteristics of a Good Mentor: (http://franchisegrowthpartners.com/mentoring)



- 1. Willingness to share skills, knowledge, and expertise.
- 2. Demonstrates a positive attitude
- 3. Takes a personal interest in the mentoring relationship
- 4. Exhibits enthusiasm in the field.
- 5. Values ongoing learning and growth in the field.
- 6. Provides Guidance and constructive feedback.
- 7. Respected by colleagues at all levels of the organization.
- 8. Sets and meets goals.
- 9. Values the opinions and initiatives of others.
- 10. Motivates others by setting a good example.

(Of course, compliant with the Diocesan Child Protection Policy as well!)

Duties of the Ministry Mentor:

- > Pray for the teen even before you meet!
- > Set up a time to meet with the teen (and possible his/her parent)
- ➤ Thank the teen for considering this ministry/service/organization
- Share why you are involved in the ministry/service/organization, how you got started, what it means to you to be involved
- > Help the teen get started with aspects of the ministry/service/organization (meeting other members, observing, asking questions, practicing skills, etc.)
- Support the teen as they participate
- Be available for ongoing questions
- Provide ongoing affirmation as appropriate
- Provide any ongoing training as needed
- Continue praying for the teen
