The Ministry of Prayer and Worship with Youth

Renewing the Vision calls us to provide opportunities for creative prayer with adolescents and promotes many opportunities for communal prayer.

"The ministry of prayer and worship

- > CELEBRATES and DEEPENS the young people's relationship with Jesus Christ by bestowal of grace, communal prayer and liturgical experiences;
- It AWAKENS their awareness of the spirit at work in their lives;
- > It INCORPORATES young people more fully into the sacramental life of the Church, especially eucharist;
- > It NURTURES the personal prayer of young people;
- > It FOSTERS family rituals and prayer (RTV, p. 44)

Before we invite youth in, we must know to what we are inviting them...

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy

A few points to be considered with teens (or anyone else!)

- ❖ The heart of the liturgy is the paschal mystery. #6
- The liturgy is the source and summit of the life of the Church. #10
- The Church earnestly desires the full, conscious and active participation of all the faithful. In fact it is "the aim to be considered before all else." #14
- Liturgical celebrations are not private functions, but rather are celebrations belonging to the Church. #26
- The liturgy should be marked by a noble simplicity. #34
- In the liturgy the Church respects the culture of the community gathered. #37
- ❖ The assembly should be fully involved in the liturgy. #48
